### Clean and Reliable Water Supplies

Senator Hurtado has led the fight to improve Valley water supplies and ensure clean drinking water, winning \$100 million to repair water conveyance canals and co-authoring the Safe and Affordable Clean Drinking Water Act.



### Improving Healthcare in the Valley

Senator Hurtado passed a law requiring insurance providers to cover reimbursement for adverse childhood experiences, a critical issue given the impacts of COVID. She won funding for the Valley Fever Institute and to help ensure vulnerable communities have access to asthma prevention services.



### Promoting Educational Opportunity

Working to promote educational opportunity, Senator Hurtado secured \$9.9 million to establish regional pipelines for students to enter medical school and \$2 million for Career Technical Education funding for community colleges in Kern and Fresno Counties.



### Keep Our Communities Safe

In the wake of California's continuing wildfire season, Senator Hurtado won important funding to open a regional fire training facility in the Valley. She continues to advocate for more resources to fight gangs and drugs in the Valley and to put more officers on the streets.
